1. Introduction

Council Members met informally between 09:00am and 10:00am.

The Council Meeting commenced at 10:00am.

1.1 Minutes endorsed by Garry Williams, seconded by Angela Williams.

2. Minutes and Actions from previous meeting

Action 2023-09 -004 – the definition explanation is loose, would still like clarification from Waka Kotahi

Action 2023-09-0008- MSAC would like to see the details of the research and would like clarification that the research is including non-ride forever training. Want details on the environmental standards research (budget, details). MSAC was told that the work is underway and is now wrapped up in the syllabus review. The funding is not an issue; however, the Council need to be assured that the quality of work is satisfactory, and it is comprehensive.

Action-09-0009 – ACC will look into this more as there is confusion over the scope of the RFP.

Action 2023-11-001- MSAC to provide feedback on the services order, which is in draft on work that is out of scope. To feedback to DG as an oversight role.



3. Waka Kotahi Presentations

3.1 High Risk Motorcycle Routes

Ralph Parkes from Waka Kotahi presented a paper on the work being done on the High-Risk Motorcycle Routes.

Action 2023-11-0002: Kenn Beer (Safe Systems Solutions) to be invited to next meeting. **Action 2023-11 – 0003:** Council asks for assurance/proof that road building includes motorcycle safety from Waka Kotahi.

3.2 Road to Zero

ACC and Waka Kotahi are working together on a Motorcycle safety strategy and looking to push this across government. Working on a Hypothesis document, which is now with targeted delivery manager at ACC. This work will align with R2Z, Chris Hurren, Waka Kotahi and how we can influence change of behaviour.

3.3 Behaviour Change Plan

It is noted that the Behaviour Change plan will be a long-term marketing campaign, which will eventually see a change in behaviour in motorcycling riding.

Looking at working with Waka Kotahi closely on this campaign. Council is concerned about the aspect that the campaign focuses on the fact that motorcyclists do not talk about their mistakes, when most do, there needs to be a balance in the campaign.

ACC will have input into the campaign before it goes to market and will take advice from Colin regarding whether MSAC will have direct input into the campaign.

Action 2023-11-0004: MSAC to write letter to WK providing feedback on motorcycle marketing campaign presented.

4. New and Emerging Priorities for ACC

4.1 Māori Equity

Progressing Māori engagement has not progressed because of capacity; however, the Road team now has Nigel Kapa who will be working in this space. ACC did work with Auckland Transport on Kaupapa Māori. However, the work will be progressed in the next PI planning.

4.2 Shiny Side Up Review

WK have said that in the current positioning of SSU they are not going to support the event and they have pulled their part of the funding. However, ACC knows that riders do like to engage with SSU events. We will be looking at taking a similar approach to MAM in which the regional team held 48 regional events. We will be using as much local resource and talent as possible; however Chris Hurren will be in the country, and we will be using him. We have two priorities:

- Sign ups
- Protecting Ride Forever

ACC will be taking a break in holding events, e.g., Kapiti, and will look for options and opportunities moving forward and will present back to Council.

ACC will share with Council the MAM pack that the Regional Injury Prevention Partners have completed, which will provide a basis SSU moving forward.



Action 2023-11-0005: ACC to keep council informed of progress on SSU and share MAM Pack

5. ARSC feedback

Report tabled. Councillor McGregor acknowledged that going to the ARSC was a positive experience and very useful. He thanked ACC for letting him attend and they made a good team.

VIC Roads are looking to do a 'lift and shift' of Ride Forever this will be pondered on. There is an opportunity to celebrate 10 years of Ride Forever.

Council "needs to lift their game" for TRAFFINZ and attend. MSAC, and ACC talk about the 5 Pillars.

6. General Discussion

ACC acknowledged the letter that the Chair wrote to Minister Jackson, thanking him for his support to the Council. Discussion took place around the way that ACC and the Council will acknowledge future contributions/service to the Council when members leave.

It is noted that in the Ride Forever Quarterly report that there is a very low uptake of Scooter Survival courses, which is concerning to Council. Council asks that this be looked into and ACC report back with a plan to increase numbers.

Action 2023-11-0006: ACC to look at away to acknowledge contributions to MSAC such as Minister Jackson.

Action 2023-11-0007: Update on Scooter Survival courses, what is being done to increase participation.
